

Boat Register report

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As you know, the boat register means different things to different people. As boat register editors, we think of ourselves as part nautical historian, part yacht broker.

The services the Boat Register provides to the association include:

- creating a sense of community
- helping members
 - sell their boats
 - find their next boat
 - find out more about or record the history of their boat
 - get help when fixing problems, making alterations, etc.
 - calculate and record the handicap for their boat
 - create and make use of crewing opportunities
- helping event organisers
 - keep track of who is coming to an event
 - create publicity for their event

We've not made many changes to the technology supporting the boat register this year. We have fixed a few bugs and made the back-end work more reliably. One area that was new last year and we haven't done anything to improve is the crewing feature. We can do more in this area if there is an appetite for it. We have made visible the date that changes were most recently made to each record. Hopefully this will help handicapper officers can see when the measurements were last updated

Here are a few numbers:

62 Boats added to the register

83 more boats now have pictures

In January 2024 we had 45 boats for sale. 13 of these are no longer on sale

In January 2025 we have 52 boats for sale, 13 of which were put on the register and sold within the year.

It is not obvious how many of the 26 boats were sold through adverts on our website as many appear on multiple sales channels.

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
